ChatGPT is a text-based conversational service that you can use via a browser or through an application for example on your mobile. It's designed to assist with a wide range of tasks: answering questions, providing explanations or generating text based on your requests.

AS A SOURCER OR RECRUITER, YOU CAN USE IT FOR

- creating a (sourcing) strategy
- discovering the market (competitors)
- understanding a position
- finding less known talent pools
- writing a job description
- crafting emails or other messages
- providing guidelines and ideas for interviews
- helping in assessments
- learning technical terms
- creating an analysis, etc.

I understand it's a steam engine, but what drives it?

Imagine you're watching a suspenseful movie (no, it's not the intake meeting), and the main character slowly reaches for a door handle to open a mysterious door.

Your heart is pounding because you're anticipating what might happen next. Will there be a jump scare, or will the room be empty?

Your brain is already predicting outcomes based on the cues you've been given. It's like when you expect that not everyone will reply to your messages, but you also expect that one of the candidates will accept an offer.



ChatGPT operates on a similar principle of predictability, but with text. It's like a super-advanced game of "fill-in-theblank" where you provide the "blank".

When you type a sentence or question into ChatGPT, the model looks at the words, the structure, and the context. It then predicts what words or phrases should logically come next to form a coherent and contextually appropriate response.

WHY IS THIS GOOD FOR US?

- You can chat with it just like with a human
- It will give you back good quality texts

WHAT IS IT NOT GOOD FOR?

- ChatGPT **is not a search engine** and not a knowledge base in its basic operation
- (In the paid version, you can browse the web by Bing and use plugins to reach the net)




So when you use ChatGPT, always remember that when it looks at your question and the context, it's trying to figure out what words and phrases are most likely to follow.

Here's a sentence. If you look at it, can you find out the rest?

"I have carefully reviewed the offer you sent me, but..."

Sure thing...:-I

ChatGPT does almost the same, as it has learned what might follow a given start and then return the *most likely* good answer to you.



OKAY, BUT IS IT FREE?

The "basic" service (ChatGPT 3.5) is available for free.

ChatGPT 4 is available with a monthly subscription. This version is more advanced, and you can install add-ons from a plugin store to enhance its capabilities.

WHAT DO I NEED: FREE OR PAID?

ChatGPT 3.5 is perfect for getting started and can help you a lot in your daily work. If you use it often, need slightly better results, want to take advantage of the plugins' features or exploit the advanced data analysis, reach the internet by Bing, it's worth subscribing. Use the Enterprise subscription if you need enhanced security and privacy.



Once you have successfully registered, you will see a chat interface where you can type in your questions (in the box at the bottom):

Cool... but by the way, I have a prompt engineer friend. What planet is he from?



A prompt is the initial text input that you provide to ChatGPT to generate a response. It's like the opening line of a conversation you ask to get the ball rolling. The prompt serves as a guide for the model, helping it understand what kind of information or response you're looking for.

Imagine when a candidate calls asking if you have more information about a position. Can you answer that? You can say something for sure, but you will ask which position he/she is thinking about and what information he/she needs.

ChatGPT will rarely ask you back, so it is our responsibility to be specific in our prompts to get great results.

Remember: it uses probabilities to guess what sentences to give you back, so the more context and detail you give it, the better answers it will give.

HOW TO ASK CHATGPT?

- Specify what role would give you the best answer to your question (e.g., start your prompt with "act as a hiring manager" or "act as a recruiter")
- Always give it context ("I am working on a job ad with DEI objectives" or "I am recruiting for an engineering role and I have to prepare for the interview")
- Specify what output you expect ("summarize the results in a spreadsheet" or "create an email to a candidate")
- If not satisfied, refine your question and ask again





WHAT ELSE?

Pay attention to highlight important details (for example, if you are analyzing competitors on 10 criteria and 2 are highly important, request it to focus on that)
Avoid ambiguity (just take the example of 'sourcing'... it is always worth explaining that you are NOT talking about procurement, but about identifying, finding and attracting candidates :))

INSPIRATION



TRY: TEXT CREATION

- Create customized outreach emails: specify what you need, what tone of text you want and as much detail as possible
- Create job descriptions: you can copy and paste an existing
 JD to follow its style
- **Craft interview questions:** give as much detail as possible about the position and ask it for ideas for questions
- Company culture write-ups: an exciting trick, ask it to tailor them to a particular candidate's style
- Generate a FAQ for candidates: have it write it once, then use it anytime
- Write social media posts: ask it to write a LinkedIn post on a specific topic, refine it, then once it has it, ask ChatGPT to turn it into a Facebook post or a Tweet



TRY: BOOST YOUR SOURCING STRATEGY

- Ask ChatGPT to highlight the hard facts from a job description and explain them in detail
- Create a candidate persona based on the information provided
- Ask it to collect relevant communities for a specific position (recommended: use a search plugin!)*
- As a first step, ask it to think out of the box and then request ideas on where relevant candidates might be
- Ask to help you find competing companies where people with similar experience are available or use a similar tech stack etc.

* Plugins are available in the paid version (ChatGPT-4).





TRY: BOOLEAN STRINGS...?

Frankly, it can be useful, but it will only work if you already have a confident knowledge of Boolean strings and you can teach it and then control the answers.

It can easily give you errors:

- using unnecessary restrictions (entering too many ANDs)
- unnecessary details: specifying ("senior engineer" OR "engineer") will not produce more hits, since the set "engineer" already contains the "senior engineer"
- use of non-existent operators (sometimes it sticks to "LOCATION:" as a Boolean operator)
- conceptual errors especially in tech positions




TRY: LEARN AND EXPLAIN

- **Explanation** of technical or other deeper professional knowledge: ask ChatGPT to explain step by step
- Ask for guidance: if you are using a recruiting tool and are not clear on how to use it, ask it to teach you (highly recommended: use a plugin with access to links, such as LinkReader, AccesLink or WebPilot)*
- **Experience levels:** ask ChatGPT to make a list of what a junior, medior or senior person in a given position should know and how to effectively assess it
- Learning strategy: if you want to teach something to others, ask them to make a plan for it
- Quick learning: use ChatGPT for summarizing articles or generating lists for quick learning
- If you want to improve in interview techniques, ask for recommendations and request concrete examples for a specific position


